* Students not placing into or out of 3126 are strongly advised to take 3125, which is designed to enable students to achieve the level of oral proficiency required for entry into 3126. For most students, the hours represented by 3125 will be in addition to the minimum of 30 hours required for the major.

** It is recommended that students complete both SPAN 3105 and 3106 before they take SPAN 3304.

***The following count as 4000-level *literature* courses:

Note:

- In-major courses: All of the above are considered in-major courses. A minimum grade of "C" is required in each of these courses. A minimum overall GPA of 2.0 as well as an in-major GPA of 2.0 are required.
- AP exam credit or IB diploma credit may possibly be used to satisfy certain requirements for the major; please see your Spanish Advisor as soon as possible to make these substitutions.
- Spanish courses may also be used to meet Area 2 requirements. See the current Curriculum for Liberal Education (CLE).
- Priority is given to Spanish majors and minors for registration in Spanish courses.

Additional Graduation Requirements:

- As a major in Spanish, you will have completed the Foreign Language (FL) requirement at Virginia Tech:
 - Students who completed 3 years of a single FL in high school have completed the requirement.
 - Students who did not complete 3 years of a single FL in high school may complete the requirement as follows:
 - Complete 2 years of a single language in high school plus 1106 or equivalent in college (these 3 hours count toward the 120 required for graduation) OR
 - Complete 1105-1106 or equivalent in college (these 6 hours do not count toward the 120 required for graduation)

Additional Information on Requirements:

- Courses for the major, minor, or Curriculum for Liberal Education cannot be taken Pass/Fail (exception: SPAN 3125 & 3126).
- Courses taken in a major or minor may count toward meeting the Curriculum for Liberal Education.
- Courses may count in only one area of the Curriculum for Liberal Education. For example, TA 2014 may only count as credit in either Area 2 OR Area 6. The exception to this rule is Area 7, where a course in this Area MAY count in another Area. See the guide to Curriculum for Liberal Education for specifics.

Transfer Credit:

- Students may transfer no more than 18 of the last 45 cr. of coursework. Study Abroad credits fall under this rule if they are not VT-sponsored study abroad programs.
- At least 25% of the major and 25% of the minor must be completed at VT. For a Spanish major, that is at least 8 credits (3 classes, essentially); for a Spanish minor, that is at least 5 credits (2 classes, essentially).
- A form titled "Authorization to Take Courses Elsewhere" must be filled out and signed by the student, the student's Spanish Advisor, and the Director of the Office of Education Abroad before the student departs on the study abroad program.
- Those who are transferring to Virginia Tech from a two-year school must complete at least 50% of the required graduation credits at Virginia Tech.

Satisfactory Progress toward Degree:

By the time a student majoring in Spanish has completed 72 semester credits (including transfer, advanced placement, advanced standing, credit by examination, and course withdrawal), the student must have completed satisfactorily the following courses in Spanish: 3105, 3106, 3304, and one of the following: 3404, 3414, 3444 or 3454. Satisfactory completion means a C or better (in each required course in the major).
