- _____ SPAN 3404 Early Peninsular Culture & Literature (3314 if completed prior to fall 2004) (3 cr.; prerequisite: 3304)
- _____ SPAN 3414 Modern Peninsular Culture & Literature (3204 if completed prior to fall 2004) (3 cr.; prerequisite: 3304)
- _____ SPAN 3444 Early Spanish American Culture & Literature (3214 if completed prior to fall 2004) (3 cr.; prerequisite: 3304)
- _____ SPAN 3454 Modern Spanish American Culture & Literature (3324 if completed prior to fall 2004) (3 cr.; prereq.: 3304)

*Students who place out of SPAN 2105 and/or 2106 should take any Spanish courses at the 3000 or 4000 level to satisfy those credit requirements.

**It is recommended that students complete both SPAN 3105 and 3106 before they take SPAN 3304.

Note:

- A minimum grade of "C" must be earned in each course completed for the Spanish minor. A minimum in-minor GPA of 2.0 is required. Only courses listed on this checksheet or approved substitutions are to be included in the Spanish minor GPA.
- Courses for the Spanish minor cannot be taken "Pass/Fail," with the exception of SPAN 3125 and 3126.
- AP exam credit or IB diploma credit may possibly be used to satisfy certain requirements for the minor; please see your Spanish Advisor as soon as possible to make these substitutions.
- Spanish courses may also be used to meet Area 2 requirements. See the current Guide to the Curriculum for Liberal Education.
- Priority is given to Spanish majors and minors for registration in Spanish courses.
